- Expert teaching of an engaging curriculum
- Strong pastoral provision enabling children to thrive socially and emotionally
- High quality adult interactions within a carefully constructed, purposeful environment
- High quality continuous provision indoors and outdoor
- A rich reading environment, with a diverse and exciting range of texts, underpins learning across all areas
- Constant review of learning progress and addressing gaps to support and challenge each individual

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A high achieving school



- ▶ 96% of our children in Reception attained a “Good Level of Development” (National 72%)
- ▶ 94% of our Year 1 children passed the phonics test this year (82% nationally)
- ▶ 80% of our Year 6 pupils met expected standard and above in reading, writing and maths combined in their KS2 SATs (national 65%)



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Induction at St Peter's

- Close links with pre-schools and nurseries/teacher visits
- Induction evening for parents
- 1:1 phone conversations between class teacher and parents

Applying for a School Place

St Peter's Church of England Primary

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- ▶ Application to start in Reception is through the Local Authority. Everyone must apply – even if there are siblings at the school already.
- ▶ Forms must be completed by the deadline (15th January 2023).
- ▶ You will be informed by LA if you have a place.
- ▶ We will contact you with details for your child's induction after Easter next year.
