### A high achieving school



- ▶96% of our children in Reception attained a "Good Level of Development" (National 72%)
- ▶94% of our Year 1 children passed the phonics test this year (82% nationally)
- ▶80% of our Year 6 pupils met expected standard and above in reading, writing and maths combined in their KS2 SATs (national 65%)


